

Our experience has shown that most children above age three, when properly oriented, are generally more cooperative without parents in the treatment area.

However, the Doctor may make exceptions in some special situations. If you are asked to enter the treatment room during the dental procedure it is important that you be aware of the role you will assume in lending the security your child may need.

Your child has been told that you may remain in the room only if he or she is cooperative. If uncooperative behavior reoccurs while you are present, you will be asked to return to the reception room. This may occur several times until your child realizes that we are truthful in our requests and we do not intend to cause him/her any harm. Once in the room please remember these important suggestions:

1. Please remain silent. Your child must not be distracted in any way. The Doctor will need his/her undivided attention.
2. Try to avoid any physical contact if possible.
3. If you are asked to leave, please do not become upset. Leave the treatment room quickly and quietly. You may be asked to return shortly thereafter.

Your child will be well cared for and more rapidly trained with your full cooperation.
